
The phone rings and the lady of the house answers, "Hello." "Mrs. Sanders please." "Speaking"

Blayney Show






Cumnock Show

Editorial.

The suitability of the current N.S.W. R.T.A. concessional registration scheme it seems once again in some quarters has been challenged. The Council's view of the scheme if properly managed within each club can in essence provide up to 365 days usage has been questioned. Within any democratic based organisation open discussion on any item major or minor is always welcomed and is a sign of an interest in the continued growth of the organisation.

The virtue of the 90 day log book scheme, [at present under consideration in Victoria], has been touted. Ninety days usage each year whenever, where ever you wish just by filling in a log book entry on the face of it seems an ideal scheme. However, I do believe this scheme has the effect partly or fully [depending on the user] of removing the user club from the travelling equation. Yes a person will have to be a member of a certified motoring historic club but where and when the vehicle is used will be between the user and the State Motoring Authority. My next question is which is the most important The Heritage Vehicle Movement or access to cheap registration? My view is that the access to cheap registration be it with restrictions in vehicle usage is a facilitating benefit of the movement but preserving our motoring heritage is most important. The Heritage Vehicle Movement is the child created by the motoring clubs. Clubs made up of people steeped in the desire to promote and save Heritage Vehicles. We would all be devastated by not having access to a registration fee that is affordable, practical, suitable for vehicles limited in their usage, but how many of us would give it up? I have been approached by persons in possession of a heritage vehicle and asked about joining our club. The question of the availability of cheap registration usually arises and in many cases when the conditions of use under the "cheap" scheme are spelt out the person suddenly loses interest. These persons are not interested in Heritage Motoring just cheap registration. Under the 90 day scheme they can join a club then go about enjoying the benefit afforded by the host club without or with only limited participation. The existing N.S.W. concessional scheme does a good job in weeding out these would be users but still attracts the true enthusiast and the desired club member. Our hobby is about preservation, and enjoying the pleasure of heritage motoring with fellow enthusiasts in other clubs or our own club, not doing our own thing and just logging on when it suits our own needs.

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
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UPDATE!!

CHILD RESTRAINT LAWS & HISTORIC VEHICLES

You may have seen the LATEST NEWS already on the RTA website. There you will find a ruling that gives conditional concession for carriage of children less than seven years old in historic vehicles not fitted with approved child restraints. The ruling says;

Motor cars, tourers and limousines can only carry one person per seating position. Seat belts must be worn, where fitted.

Drivers of historic vehicles registered under the conditional registration scheme are exempt from the requirement to fit child restraints when carrying children between 12 months and seven years of age, provided:

- They have written advice from an authorised engineering signatory that it is not reasonably practicable to install seatbelts and/or child restraints in the historic vehicle, and
- This written advice is carried in the vehicle when transporting any child between 12 months and seven years of age.

All passengers under 12 months of age must be restrained in an approved child restraint.

Although the process of obtaining the ruling commenced mid-2010, it is reasonable to conclude that representations from clubs to their local MP and the Minister for Transport on the matter had some effect in accelerating the finalisation and issue of the ruling. Council thanks those clubs who put time and effort into pursuing the matter.

Whilst the outcome is not perfect it at least gives us an avenue to gain exemption for those vehicles which can't be modified without enormous cost. Council will continue our efforts to obtain a more comprehensive exemption through changes to the road rules legislation.
