Kevin Bowyer wrote an article titled. "My first bee sting"

It was springtime in the Orange district, the orchards where in flower. I had a job at Wangarrie sawmill and was asked by a friend who worked in the sawmill if I would like to go, after work, and have a look at some bees he had in an orchard. The beekeeper had an FC Holden Ute, we stopped at the bees, and he got out. he put his vail on then lit the smoker. He then took the hive apart to find the queen. We found the Queen in the third frame, this was the first time in my life I had seen a queen. This was very interesting for me. Sitting inside the Ute got a bit warm so I wound the window down about an inch to have some air, then a bee stung me on the end of my nose., my eyes filled with water, then I started sneezing along with the pain., My nose was out of shape for a while. The next morning everything was back to normal. My bee keeper friend was the late George Lambert who lived at Spring Hill. At the time, I was living at Spring Hill road, Lucknow, now Beasley Road. George picked me up on the way to the sawmill, the subject to and from work was bees. The more I listened, the more I wanted to learn . There was no time wasted in me buying a hat, vail and hive tool. George had bees at Panuana on yellow box that where yielding honey. This was my first Saturday out. I enjoyed being out in the bush and everything about the honey industry, and just couldn't get enough bee work, so from then on, it became a regular weekend event. I did get a few stings on the arms but luckily, had no allergic reaction. In return for my work, I was given some hives. At this time, I traded my old FJ ute in on a brand new 1964 EH Holden ute so I could do more work with bees.

To get some extra money I took on an Orchard pollination contract. I moved 15 hives that unfortunately all got hit with some spray and ended up as a total loss.

At this time the saw mill offered me a job at Yetholme, which I took. After work I worked on boxes and frames for the hives .I needed a truck now, so ended up buying a 1949 Bedford from Rural Motors in Orange. After a fairly good season, conditions set in dry. George came from the Mid north coast before moving to Spring Hill, He had experience working with the Bell Bowrie paper bark tea tree that help produce great honey. We moved all the hives to Laurieton on the weekends after work, travelling up on Friday nights and returning on Sunday evenings to start work again on Monday mornings. We agreed to sell Honey to a packer from Mudgee who was paying above market prices. The tee tree yielded well so we had a good supply. After selling all the honey to him, the Cheque bounced and the packer went bankrupt. He later started a business in an arcade in Sydney. We got to know the Putty Road very well during this period. 


Millthorpe train station 25/02/2018



14 cars attended the Millthorpe railway station, prior to continuing on to Lunch at the Bee keepers Inn on Sunday 25th February. The last two pictures show new cars to the club. A Chevrolet and a Vauxhall. A nice cool day with the threat of rain, but a welcome change to heat we have been having.

1910 Model 14 B



The oldest Buick to make an appearance at the 50th Anniversary meet in Echuca in 2017 was the Model 14 B owned by George Gillott

and featured locally in the Riverine Herald at that time.

Released in 1910, the Model B was the smallest automobile Buick has ever built and it was powered by a 127 cubic inch, horizontally opposed and water cooled two cylinder engine that was also the smallest ever Buick motor to power an automobile.

Nevertheless, this engine came with the famous overhead valve train that was a Buick trademark from the earliest days of Buick production including its pre automobile engine production days.

With 127 cubic inch displace-

ment it was rated at 14.2 hp, however under test Buick achieved 22 hp from this engine when called upon by other manufacturers and supervised by an early automobile magazine reporter.

This model was generally referred to as the *Buggyabout* and was a great contender for the popular market taking on such notable adversaries as Ford's Model T which was released in 1908.

Much like the Model T, the model 14 had a two speed transmission although not of the planetary design preferred by Ford.

The Model 14 weighed in just below 1500 lbs and so was capable of a good turn of speed and brisk performance to match.


At US\$550 f. o. b. factory, it included the rubber top, glass

front, oil lamps, tail lamp, generator, gas headlights, horn and a repair outfit. The only factory options available at extra cost were a speedometer and Prest-O-Lite equipment instead of gas generator.

The Model 14 was available with either a box or a tank in the rear. With a box the Buick came in black, with a tank the car was painted red.

It is reported that the Model I4B appeared in I9II with the only major change being the relocation of the fuel tank from under the seat to the rear of the vehicle.

With a wheelbase of 79" and a track of 56", this Buick came with 30 x 3 tyres and two wheel brakes, internal expanding in the rear hubs.

The following extract comes from the Riverine Herald, Friday October 13th edition

George Gillott's 1910 Roadster is the oldest Buick in Echuca-Moama for the anniversary celebrations.

It was the oldest in Australia for many years but George has heard of someone who has imported a 1907 vehicle from the United States.

Still, he is pretty happy with the car he owns.

"I've had it for 15 years," George said of the 14B.

"It originally came out from America in pieces and a guy called Jim Eisenhauser had it.

I bought it off him because he was getting too old to keep up with the maintenance.

He could have sold it to someone in America but he wanted to see it kept here in Australia and be used."

George does use the car, driving it regularly although it did come down to Echuca-Moama on the back of a trailer from his home in Sydney.

"It goes alright." George said.

The car is pretty much the same condition as when George bought it, including the leprechaun logo on the side of the car.

"Everything's pretty good. It's very reliable and Buicks are renowned for that.

"It has a three-litre two-cylinder engine and a two-speed gearbox. It can go from a walking speed to 80 km/h in top gear.

It has kerosene fuelled side lights and acetylene gas lights but they're not that effective."

"I can't see the road with them." George said, meaning he doesn't try to drive it at night.

The only real drawback is the lack of wipers. "I'd like to have a windscreen in this weather." George said referring to the rain.




