Annual Inspection Day (Revision Notice)

The annual club inspection day will be held on Sunday 26th November 2017 at the car club building starting from 8am.

Vehicles on conditional registration with the ODAMC with a registration expiry date between 26th November 2017 and 26th May 2018 will be inspected on this day. This is because the certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) and the club safety checks are now valid for 6 months. If you are unable to attend on the day then a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) may be required for the vehicle.

The following documentation will need to be sighted and details recorded by the Registration Officer on the day.

- 1. Historic Vehicle Declaration (RMS form #1259) partially filled out.
- 2. Registration Papers current or renewal.
- 3. Current certificate of Comprehensive Insurance
- 4. Proof of Club Membership.
- 5. Certificate of Operations for the vehicle (Purple Form kept in the vehicle).

Note.

The annual inspection of vehicles on Conditional Registration outside of the expiry dates listed above may require either an ODAMC roadworthy check or a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip). This will be at the discretion of the Registration Officer

The Historic Vehicle Declaration Form will <u>not</u> be signed off this year unless the above documents are sighted and details recorded by the Club Registration Officer beforehand.

Club members with vehicles on HCRS are reminded if their membership fees are not paid by the due date they are not financial members and their registration and CTP will be void! (ie the vehicle is unregistered and uninsured).

Austin-Healey Sprite


The Austin-Healey Sprite is a small open sports car which was produced in the United Kingdom from 1958 to 1971. The Sprite was announced to the press in Monte Carlo by the British Motor Corporation on 20 May 1958, just before that year's Monaco Grand Prix. It was intended to be a low-cost model that "a chap could keep in his bike shed", yet be the successor to the sporting versions of the pre-war Austin Seven. The Sprite was designed by the Donald Healey Motor Company, with production being undertaken at the MG factory at Abingdon. It first went on sale at a price of £669, using a tuned version of the Austin A-Series engine and as many other components from existing cars as possible to keep costs down.

When the Mk. II Sprite was introduced in 1961 it was joined by a <u>badge-engineered MG</u> version, the <u>Midget</u>, reviving a model name used by MG from the late 1920s through to the mid 1950s. Enthusiasts often refer to these later Sprites and Midgets collectively as "Spridgets." The MG-badged version of the car continued in production for several years after the Austin-Healey brand ceased to exist.

Mark III

The Mark III Sprite was also marketed as the Mark II MG Midget – differences between the two were again restricted to minor trim detailing. Although still 1098 cc, the engine had a stronger block casting, and the size of the crankshaft main bearings was increased to two inches (engine code 10CC).

A new (slightly) curved-glass windscreen was introduced with hinged quarterlights and wind-up side windows. Exterior door handles were provided for the first time, with separate door locks. Though the car could now be secured, with a soft-top roof the added protection was limited. The rear suspension was modified from quarter-elliptic to semi-elliptic leaf springs, which gave a more comfortable ride for a near-negligible weight penalty as well as providing additional axle location, the upper links fitted to the quarter-elliptic models being deleted. Though scarcely sybaritic, these changes helped the Sprite and Midget compete with the recently released Triumph Spitfire. 25,905 Mark III Sprites were made. Engine:1964–66: 1098 cc <u>A-Series</u> 14,59 hp (44 kW) at 5750 rpm and 65 lbf·ft (88 Nm) at 3500 rpm





The Namoi Valley Antique Vehicle Club (NVAVC) is honoured to be again given the privilege to host the Council of Heritage Motor Club's (CHMC) Annual Rally in 2018 in our Fortieth Anniversary year and twenty eight years after first hosting in 1990.

The format for the Rally will be similar to previous rallies, but with the facilities not available to cater for the expected entry numbers at a realistic cost, we have had to look at alternatives.

We hope that you can participate over the Easter weekend and enjoy the environs of the Namoi Valley, as well as the camaraderie of like-minded people. You are welcome to arrive early and depart later than the Easter weekend to enjoy the local attractions. Rally activities will be as follows:

Friday

From 10.00 am to 4.30 pm - Registration at Narrabri Information Centre, with a welcome cuppa supplied. There is an option of a fish meal at the RSL or your choice at other town venues. The CHMC AGM will be held at 7.30 pm at the RSL.

Saturday

Assemble at 9.00 am for a car display behind the Information Centre. This display will encompass the Concours d'Elegance and Mal Mason Judging. The display is a short walking distance from the town centre and will allow those inclined to shop or have coffee if desired. After lunch entrants will be free to choose their afternoon activity at their leisure.

Please note that the display venue is within close proximity to KFC, McDonald's, Subway, the Bakery and other food outlets if you wish to make use of that option for lunch.

Dinner from 7.00 pm will be at the RSL. There will be no music so people can talk, but light entertainment will be provided.

Saturday afternoon tour options to include:

- 1. Santos Gas Field Coach Tour: Numbers are limited and are available on a first served basis, cost \$8.00 per head. Allow approx three hours.
- 2. Self Drive to the Fish Farm for a tour. Can cater for approx 40 vehicles. Cost \$8.00 per head. Please note this is approx 20 km from Narrabri and has approx 5 km of heritage road. Allow approx three hours.
- 3. Self drive to Mt Kaputar National Park, approx 50 km east of Narrabri. This again contains heritage road and is not recommended for two wheel braked vehicles. An excellent trip to be done with caution. Allow four hours.
- 4. Self drive to the CSIRO Telescope approx 22 km and Yarrie Lake a further 6 km, with only a short section of heritage road at Yarrie Lake. Allow approx two hours.
- 5. Visit the Old Gaol Museum in the town precinct. Allow at least an hour.
- 6. Self drive to Sawn Rocks, about 33 km on a bitumen road, with an easy walk to the Rocks. Allow 2.5 to 3 hours. Parking is limited to about 20 cars at any one time.


