Annual Inspection Day

The Annual Club Inspection Day will be held on Sunday 25th November 2018 at the Car Club Building starting from 8am.

Vehicles on conditional registration with the ODAMC with a registration expiry date between 25th November 2018 and 25th May 2019 will be inspected on this day. This is because the certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) and the club safety checks are now valid for 6 months. If you are unable to attend on the day then a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) may be required for the vehicle.

The following documentation will need to be sighted and details recorded by the Registration Officer on the day.

- 1. Historic Vehicle Declaration (RMS form #1259) partially filled out.
- 2. Registration Papers Current or renewal.
- 3. Current certificate of Comprehensive Insurance.
- 4. Proof of Club Membership.
- 5. Certificate of Operations for the vehicle (Purple Form kept in the vehicle).

Note

The annual inspection of vehicles on Conditional Registration outside of the expiry dates listed above may require either an ODAMC roadworthy check or a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip). This will be at the discretion of the Registration Officer.

The Historic Vehicle Declaration Form will <u>not</u> be signed off this year unless the above documents are sighted and details recorded by the Club Registration Officer beforehand.

Club members with vehicles of HCRS are reminded if their membership fees are not paid by the due date they are not financial members and their registration and CTP will be void! (ie the vehicle is unregistered and uninsured).

Thursday, 5 July - Mid-Week Event.

Report by Charles Stammers

The July Mid-Week Event involved a visit to the Canobolas Zone Rural Fire Services Command Centre on Forest Road. On a mild and sunny morning members and partners gathered at Cook Park to travel to the RFS facility, to be introduced to Superintendent Brett Bowden, who was to be our tour guide. Firstly, it was morning tea in the splendid appointed dining area, after which Brett took us on a tour of the facility, showing us the training rooms, then into the nerve centre, complete with a myriad of screens that provide them with a large array of information in real and projected time; weather temperature and humidity, wind speed and direction, other fires in NSW, images of the progress of fires, and a comprehensive network of communications systems. Brett also showed a lot of images of the 2018 Canobolas fire over its period. Following this tour, we were shown over the outdoor training area, where training for road accidents, car fires, emergencies, confined spaces rescues, etc. is conducted. To those attending, the technology available nowadays is staggering, with many of us recollecting the earlier days where blitz and ex-army trucks, knapsacks, green tree branches, and wet wheat bags were the tools of trade used.

Some statistics on the Canobolas Zone, the Orange facility is responsible for 12,000 square kilometres, 83 brigades, over 180 vehicles, and a population of 120,000. The facility has now been in operation for 10 years, and was the first of that design in NSW, and was so successful that all facilities since that time are now constructed to that concept.

I what seemed no time at all, it was time to locate a venue for lunch, with the Millthorpe Newsagency and Café coming out on top, so we journeyed there for a delicious lunch and much chatting and tall stories before heading home.




