Brett gave us a very informative and interesting insight into the makeup of modern fuels and the problems that can arise from long periods of non use. He also touched on the problems that can arise from the use of Ethanol based fuel. I think we all went away with a much better conception of our fuel system and how to combat situations that can occur with our cherished cars.







SOME HISTORY -- ABOUT -- THE MINI

Late in 1956 Sir Alex Issigonis was given a brief by BMC Management to design a baby car due to the closing of the Suez Canal. It took the chairman of the company only a short test drive in the prototype called 'the orange box' to decide to go ahead with the project.

An engineer named Jack Danuels did a lot of development work with the designer Issigonis on the car. They drew on information on a prototype front wheel drive Morris Minor built about 1952.

A lot of early testing in 1957-58 was done at Chalgrove airfield near Oxford. The first prototype had engine opposite to the car we now know, but problems with carby icing forced the engineers to reverse the engine around-putting the carby at the rear.

Suspension development received a lot of input from Alex Moulton who developed the rubber cone suspension and the later hydrolastic systems used on a lot of later BMC models.

Problems with driveshaft joints were numerous in the development of the car till they found a version of the Rzeppa Joint which was used on Royal Navy submarine conning towers. Hardy Spicer took up the design for use in the motor industry.

Retaining lubricant in the joints was also a problem till a rubber boot was developed.

Test drives used to take the cars to a village called Garsington, and drive around and around a large tree, testing the boots. There is a story that the tree died from lubricant poisoning.

The Mini was released on the U.K. market in August 1959. Production reached 6000 units weekly in the mid sixties. A total of 5,366,461 have been produced up till May this year. The car takes about 36 hours to build compared to 10.5 hours for a small Nissan on a modern production line. The Mini body was designed with exposed body seams which are unsuitable for welding by robots. Some model body shells are now back in production.

Australian built models were built at Victoria Park, Sydney. This park was an old racecourse and covered 57 acres. The plant was closed in 1974 and sold to the Federal Government. It has recently been sold again for a high rise development. The only building that will remain is the old Totalizator Building which housed the BMC Service Dept. this now being a heritage building.

The car was released in Australia in 1961 followed by the Mini Coopers in 1962 and Moke and vans in 1964.

The festivities will kick off with the Mini's Homecoming – a static display on the site of the former BMC factory at Zetland, Sydney.

The grand finale will be the Oz50 Mini Festival at Wakefield Park, Goulburn.

In the week between will be a number of events – dinners, tours to Bathurst and Katoomba (Catalina Park Racing Circuit), a boat cruise and a Mini movie night.


