USE OF VEHICLES ON HISTORIC REGISTRATION.

As we move into the 2017 club year it is timely to remind club members who have vehicles registered under the conditional historic registration scheme regardless of whether they have opted for the log book system or not, that they are required to attend three authorised club runs throughout the calendar year to retain their continued authorisation for concessional registration for the next ensuing year.

A motion to this effect was adopted at the club meeting on Monday 18th April 2016, the purpose being to curtail club membership being utilised as a convenience to obtain historic registration to avail themselves of the sixty day unconditional use of vehicles so registered for private use as permitted under the current Roads and Maritime Services approved log book scheme.

It is imperative that any club member who is proposing membership of a new club member that they make that applicant aware of this condition so that membership if approved, that applicant is not seeking membership only for the purpose of private useage of a vehicle on historic registration.

As a final comment, vehicles which have nominated for the current log book scheme are not eligible to be considered for three club runs in the calendar year unless they are authorised club runs which do not require to be entered on the daily log sheet.

As we are in a new year, there have been a few changes to the office bearers, these have all been updated so I would ask you all to read them and let me know if there are any errors or items that need correcting.

Once again, I will ask if anybody would like to receive their copy of the magazine by email. This is a much cheaper way to receive your mag and of course it is in full colour. just give me your address and email address and i will swap you over.

All Members are reminded that those who have not paid their membership club dues (due in November) and are using cars that display H plates (Historic Registration) that as from 01/01/17 you are non financial members of the club and as a result are now driving unregistered, uninsured vehicles, under RMS guidelines you could face a fine of \$2000. This includes people who have opted for the 60 day log book system. You must be a financial member of a recognized club to have the privilege of using the H plate system. you will be deleted from the ODAMC mailing list as from this month. If you have not paid your club membership fee, so please do so.

The events committee have met again and have managed to get some exciting new club runs and events up and running for 2017. It is a lot easier for a group of people to do this rather than leaving this task to one person. If you have any ideas for any events or runs that would like to happen, please let us know so we can include it in the events calendar. Please note that the run set down for Sunday 22nd January to the Amos's for lunch has been rescheduled to 26th February. 22nd now has a different run, as per the events page.

This months edition has an interesting article I saw in the ASCC magazine that I thought you might all be interested in and something we all need to keep in mind.

ADVICE FROM SMG - FROM RMS REGARDING CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION

Historic Conditional Registration (HCRS) (or HCS) & Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS). (Now including modified vehicles under 3.5 tonnes GVM). We are almost there with the introduction of the CVS for modified vehicles. ACMC is in regular contact with the RMS and have been informed that they are awaiting the sign-off by one Director before Terry Thompson will be called in to sign the official paperwork prior to the scheme commencing. All clubs should take note that RMS has made it plain that once the CVS is in operation the RMS will offer a "period of grace" before the RMS inspectors come down on vehicle owners who have incorrect vehicles on the HCRS scheme. With the introduction of the CVS there will no longer be any excuse for clubs, registrars and owners to fudge the originality rules of the Historic Vehicle Scheme. There is no longer any need to argue over the interpretation of the rules. Any modifications or any doubt about interpretation should immediately mean that the vehicle should be registered under the CVS. A significant percentage of vehicles now on H-plates will have to move quickly to the new scheme. Penalties and Fines: The penalty for owners who exploit the HCRS by registering modified

cars will be cancellation of the rego plus the club concerned will come under question for its right to be on the approved list. The fine / offence for not using the Log Book correctly, is to be a \$440 fine and the loss of 4 points. There have been reports of the new forms for the CVS already being available at some RMS offices. We have also had reports of owners who by-pass the Registrars to successfully renew their H-plate registrations by presenting a pink slip and the 1259 form at RMS. Some RMS staff may not be fully conversant with the requirements but this will not save any owner who has not correctly registered the vehicle. The club stamp must be affixed to the 1259 form and two stamps will be required when registering on the CVS.

This is a club magazine, not the editor's magazine. CARCOAR VILLAGE FESTIVAL AUSTRALIA DAY 2107

Your club is invited to participate in our *Carcoar Village Festival*, Australia Day, Thursday, 26 January 2017.

Festivities will kick off at 8.30am with a host of attractions throughout the day. A highlight will be the re-enactments performed by the *Gold Trails Re-enactment Group*, featuring actors performing events that occurred in Carcoar and surrounds and being made particularly realistic by the use multiple riders on horseback.

Additionally, there will be live music featuring November Shorn, Cobb and Co carriage rides, vintage cars, amusements and entertainment for the kids including the wonderful Murphy's Puppets and much more. In recognition of Carcoar's importance as the third oldest settlement west of the Blue Mountains, all five historic museums will be open on the day.

The historic courthouse will host talks by two authors on bushranger history: Craig Bratby (John Vane, Biography of a Bushranger) and Peter Bradley (Ben Hall – Stories from the Hard Road). In addition, remarkable story teller Craig Lawler, recently featured on *Conversations with Richard Fidler* nationally on ABC radio, will appear and give a highly entertaining narrative on the struggle between police inspector Sir Frederick Pottinger and his nemesis Ben Hall.

We propose to locate the vintage cars back on the banks of the Belubula River. Also, we would like the various vintage car groups to choose a selection of cars to form the parade this year. We would like you to provide information about vehicles chosen to participate in the parade, so that our professional announcer can read out the story of each vehicle, as it approaches the corner of Belubula and Icely streets on its way back to the river bank. We would like 12-15 cars representing all the groups to participate.

The parade of cars would take place at noon and be a highlight of the festival.

To All Club Secretaries.

Council's Committee is concerned that important information from Council to some affiliated Clubs appears at times to be either incorrectly interpreted or poorly communicated to club members. This issue has been drawn to the attention of Council through certain material published in some Club newsletters and via comments from delegates at Council Meetings, reporting on what has, or more seriously, has not been communicated at their own club.

This problem involves only a very few clubs but such incorrect information imparted to their club members often quickly spreads through the movement, causing confusion and issues for other clubs.

Council's Committee asks all affiliated clubs to be on the alert for the spread of misinformation, especially with regards to vehicle registration, if in doubt a call or email to a Committee member will quickly be responded to with bona fide information.

Of concern too is inaccurate information from sources outside CHMC that has been given prominence over the consistently accurate information provided by Council. It appears that certain organisations and individuals have sought to communicate to affiliated clubs material which discredits CHMC apparently in an endeavour to encourage those clubs to transfer their allegiance. For example, a contribution to a recent club newsletter stated that CHMC did not advise of the Log Book System, and that it was necessary to gain opinion from an organisation other than CHMC on the Log Book initiative. In fact CHMC advised all its affiliated Clubs on 8th September 2015 of the Log Book introduction - 4 days after the Minister's announcement of the Log Book Trial. Then CHMC arranged for the relevant senior RMS officer, Peter Wells, to address club delegates at the first opportunity - the 2015 General Meeting at Orange on 24th October 2015. CHMC quickly published a record of that discussion and the relevant Q&A on the CHMC website, and provided the most up-to-date information, confirmed with the RMS, through mail-outs to Clubs and on the CHMC website.

Club delegates attending that 2015 Orange General Meeting had the opportunity to take back to their clubs the most reliable information at that time on the Log Book option. Similarly at the recent 2016 General Meeting at Parkes delegates were appraised, within the bounds of our confidentiality agreement with RMS, of various matters of importance to clubs.

Committee is aware that attendance at the two CHMC meetings per year may involve lengthy travel for some club delegates, no matter which Club elects to host a meeting or Rally. It is not reasonable to expect all Clubs to expend significant time and resources to attend all CHMC meetings, however as these meetings are correctly reported in the Minutes distributed to all clubs it is reasonable to expect that individual club members are accurately advised of Council's actions and transactions, especially those with the RMS.

To facilitate more direct contact with Clubs and their members Council's Committee is exploring the concept of conducting forums in some centres in NSW where members of the Committee will address matters relating to Heritage Motoring such as vehicle registration, and respond to questions from attendees. Whilst the forums would be directed at groups of CHMC affiliated Clubs, attendance by non-affiliates need not be discouraged. Forums could be conducted in areas such as the Far North Coast; Mid North Coast; Hunter & Central Coast; Far West; Central West; Northern Tablelands; South Eastern; Riverina; etc.

Such a concept would involve a cost to Council, although Committee members are willing to commit to the time involved there are insufficient funds in the budget to cover their out of pocket expenses. Options include: a small charge to participate in the forum, assistance with accommodation, or increasing the travel budget and possibly therefore Club affiliation fees.

Please consider this forum concept and provide any input your club may have towards it. Would your Club be willing to host such a forum, and assist in encouraging other heritage vehicle clubs to attend? Is any particular time or day more suitable than any other?

Many clubs are anticipating the announcement of the Classic Vehicle Scheme for modified vehicles. As Council has indicated to RMS its intention to apply to be one of the peak bodies for this Scheme would regional forums shortly after the Scheme's announcement be appreciated by Clubs?

Council looks forward to your considered response to this concept.


