

1964 LIGHTBURN ZETA SPORTS

494cc Fichtel &Sachs 2 cyl 20.5 HP 4speed manual transmission 125km/h

In the late 1950's, Harold Lightburn, manufacturer of whitegoods, concrete mixers and hydraulic jacks, was convinced that Australian families were ready for a second car. He commenced production of light station wagon powered by a 324cc Villiers driving the front wheels. The gearbox setup meant that top speed (60mph) was available both forward and reverse.



The Zeta was introduced at about the same time as the BMC Mini, and the public seemed to prefer the latter as a second car. Only 363 Zeta wagons were sold.

Undeterred, Lightburn pushed ahead with plans to produce a sports car based upon a Michelotti design. It seems that most Zeta Sports were built in 1961, but for some reason, the car was not introduced until 1964.

Whilst Lightburn had a network of Alfa Romeo dealerships at the ready, public response was poor.

Only 28 Zeta Sports were built


