General Business:

Kevin Penson sent a condolence card to the family of Allan Payne on behalf of the Club.

Keith Packham gave report on AGM of CHMC. There is a meeting with RMS on 23rd May. Main topics will be "H" plates, Classic Car Scheme and Log Book Scheme. There is an online survey available for either individuals or Clubs. Committee has submitted a form on behalf of the Club and Keith will bring a copy of our submission to the next Meeting.

Anne Magill reported that there had been a mistake picked up in the latest Register of Members. Anne requested that members advise her promptly of any errors.

Anne reported that the Club had obtained a part Grant to cover the purchase of a defibrillator. Total cost is \$2675, Grant is \$1300 and Club would have to pay \$1375. Nigel Coutts, who has some experience in this

field, explained that any person could use it as the machine was self- explanatory and self- regulating .i.e.it is not possible to use the machine on a patient if it was the wrong treatment. Motion to proceed was proposed by Dave Gray, seconded by Eddy Livermore. Carried.

Peter Amos outlined the Club's financial position following the increase of printing the Magazine from .70c to \$2 per copy. This is by far our greatest expense. Various suggestions were made to reduce the costs including Electronic only and Bi-Monthly magazine, but it was decided to keep to the present format. Peter explained that with other increases in cost it would be necessary to increase the annual fees to \$60 at next AGM to cover. Members appeared to accept the position.

Secretary reported that no members had come forward to record the attendance at events for the points score. Secretary is prepared to collate the figures on the spreadsheet but it will now be up to members to advise if they have attended an event. There will be a book at each meeting to record the details. If you are unable to attend a meeting it will be necessary to contact the Secretary.


