



Penson . Seconded Bob McNeil. Carried.

Business arising: Painting of Club house - Secretary advised that correspondence accepting the grant had been forwarded to the Crown Lands Funding Program on 23/1/14 and Wayne Wilson Painter & Decorator advised of his successful tender. He was again contacted this date and indicated that he intends to commence the painting on 3rd March 2014 subject to the weather. Also Ken Gazzard and Bob Boaden had undertaken to carry out the work of fitting new down pipes and flashing which was well underway and nearing completion.

Correspondence out: Letter to Crown Lands advising of acceptance of grant for painting as mentioned in the above business arising.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Boaden tabled the treasurer's report and financial statement. Questions invited. One account presented for payment Assure Insurance \$483.45 for Club House building insurance and likely refund claims in the area of \$390 for expences incurred for down pipe/fittings and flashing for work being undertaken prior to painting. Moved Bob Boaden Sec: Bob McNeil that the treasurer's report be accepted and the accounts as presented be passed for payment. Carried.

Editors report: Chris was absent due to other commitments but sent apologies for the lack of printing quality for the February magazine due a technical hitch. Previously always up to a high standard and he welcomes any suitable material for inclusion in the In the magazine.

Events report: John Streetfeild reported on various past events including the BYO twilight dinner at the Club house on 6th February with 22 people in attendance. He also spoke on future events and called for a show of hands for catering purposes for the run to Neville on 23rd February which will be over by the time this magazine is printed. The runs on 6th March to Moodys Vineyard and Spring Hill hotel for lunch and on **SATURDAY** 15th March to Wellington. Those who were **NOT** at the meeting and who are desirous of participating in either of these events to contact him for catering numbers.

General Business: Secretary Bruce raised the question as to whether or not attendance at Club meetings should be counted as a club event for the purpose of point scoring towards the Les White Memorial Trophy. Whilst not specifically defined the attendance at club meetings is not mentioned in By-Law No.7 where the original intent was to

encourage members to participate in club runs in vehicles which are eligible for club registration. President Keith called for a show of hands which ruled in favour of attendance at club meetings to be regarded as club runs for point scoring purposes.

The future timing of the pre-1931 Autumn Tour in relation to the Dinosaurs Driver's Club at Cowra and whether or not Dubbo should be included in the rotation was raised by President Keith. The pros and cons were discussed at length which would mean that ODAMC would share the pre-1931 tour on a three year cycle instead of the present biannual cycle. The general thinking was that by alternating with the Cowra club pre-1931 vehicles would be adequately catered for. Dubbo could consider running a seperate rally in their own right and which no doubt draw entries from both Orange and the Cowra Clubs. The proposal was put to a show of hands who were in favour ODAMC running the pre-1931 Autumn Tour on the current two year cycle with the Cowra Dinosaurs on the alternate years if they so desired. President Keith to inform the Dubbo Club of the decision of ODAMC.

The letter from M/s Wendy Muddell as mentioned in the incoming correspondence was again discussed as it had been done at the September 2013 meeting and the ODAMC was not receptive to the CHMC insurance proposal she had put forward. The club resolved that delegate President Keith would vote on the proposal at the half yearly CHMC meeting at Bathurst on 26/10/13 as he saw fit. Keith reported that this meeting did not appear to be enthusiastic and advised our club accordingly.

Members again discussed the proposal and due to the lack of sufficient information to make an informed decision on whether to support the change from our existing insurance policies it was moved by Andrew McDougall and Seconded by John Nicholson "That in the light of no proper proposal being presented by the CHMC in regard to the conditions and costing of insurance cover that this club does not support the current proposal and that our present insurance cover remain intact." CARRIED The Secretary to write to M/s Muddell and advise her of the Club's decision.

Permission to move was requested by Bernie Schell to participate in the Tiddlers & Tadpoles run conducted by the Antique Motor Cycle Club of Aust. at Maldon, Victoria on his 1914 Triumph Motor Cycle No. 5261-H on 2nd March 2014. Moved Ken Gazzard Sec: Lloyd Stevens that permission be granted. Carried.

The invitation to the 25th Ridge Crest Car Camp at Mumbil from 14-16th March 2014 be made a club run. Moved by Lloyd Stevens Sec: Bob McNeil CARRIED.

The Special Interest Rotary Club Expo at the Orange PCYC on Sunday 16th March 2014 be made a club run with President Keith authorised to pay the \$30 entry fee if required and advise club members of further details. Moved Kerry Risstrom Sec: Kevin Penson CARRIED.


We left Sydney at 8.30am on Monday had a good trip home stopped for photos on Mount Victoria and arrived home in Orange at 3pm.


Australia Day 2014

- 2. Refrain from yelling abuse at characters on the screen. Tests have proven they can't hear you.


Weddings:
