In January's newsletter, Kevin had some photographs of spotted gum. He has added some more to his story and those pictures.

Spotted gum are found on the coast of NSW and they flower in autumn and winter. Whilst working the bees through winter you could often end up getting 40 or more stings a day, this was sometimes compensated by the sound of the lyre bird of in the forest. Leaving Batemans Bay with a truck load of honey could an hour just to get over the Clyde mountains. We often had honey stolen and sometimes vandals would smash the hives and boxes with the bull bars on their ute's or trucks, just for the fun of it. We used to camp out during this time in our caravan and often had to leave the electric heating on all night to keep warm.






