Bob McNeil sent in an email he received regarding the rally. Hi Bob,


Thanks for your company and support over the weekend and to the clubs great organisation and hospitality for the rally. It was a great rally and very enjoyable!

Kevin Bowyer added some explanations for tools, taken from the Austin club magazine.

Skill saw =A portable cutting tool used to make studs to short,

Belt sander = An electric sanding tool commonly used to convert minor touch up jobs into major refinishing jobs.

Vice grips = generally used after pliers to completely round off bolt heads. If nothing else is available, they can also be used to transfer intense welding heat to the palm of your hand. **Two ton engine hoist** = a tool for testing the maximum tensile strength of everything you forgot to disconnect.

Pry bar = A tool used to crumple the metal surrounding that clip or bracket you needed to remove in order to replace a 50cent part.

Table saw = A large stationary power tool commonly used to launch wood projectiles for testing wall integrity.

Hose cutter = A tool used to make hoses to short.

Hydraulic Floor jack = used for lowering a car to the ground after you have installed new brake shoes ,trapping the jack handle firmly under the bumper bar.

Hack saw = One of a family of cutting tools built on the Ouija board principle....It transforms human energy into a crooked, unpredictable motion, and the more you attempt to influence it's course the more dismal your future becomes.

Band saw = A large stationary power saw primarily used by most shops to cut good aluminum sheet into smaller pieces that fit the rubbish bin after you cut on the inside of the line instead of the outside.

Hard to Believe - but it's True

At 50mph a 1939 Chevrolet car does the following:

- Crankshaft: travels at 2740 rpm
- Pistons travel 10,275 ft per minute, or 1.93 miles per minute.
- Valves open and close 16,440 times per minute.
- Water pump circulates 47 gallons per minute.
- Fan revolves 4,000 times per minute.
- Coil delivers 8,220 sparks per minute.
- Each spark plug fires 1,370 times per minute.
- Road wheels revolve 650 rpm.
- Car is travelling 73.3 ft per second.
- Fuel consumption is .33 pints per minute.

In a journey of 100 miles: Crankshaft travels 328,800 revolutions. Pistons travel 231.6 miles. Valves open and close 1,972,800 times. Water pump circulates 5,640 gallons of water.

Each spark plug fires 164,400 times. Road wheels revolve 78,000 times. Fuel consumtpion is 5 gallons. Each piston is started from rest and brought to rest twice in each revolution of the crankshaft for a total of 1,515,200 times in 100 miles.

Fan revolves 480,000 times. Coil delivers 986,400 sparks.

At 50mph, the Piston is:

- Accelerated from rest to a maximum speed of 47.5mph in .0005 sec (one two-thousandths of a second) and brought to a maximum speed to rest again in an equal space of time.

Under these conditions the maximum inertia load (eight of piston, rings, pin and bushing) on each connecting rod bearing each time the piston is started from or brought to rest is 1,670lbs or over 3/4 ton.

Bearing failure at high speed may release these forces to cause extensive damage to the crankshaft and other engine parts.

Genuine parts and preventive inspection will forestall this type of failure.
