Letter to Mrs. Betty Naylor, Publicity Officer, Orange Show Society in answer to her request for cars for display advising that the Club would endeavour to provide 6-8 cars for display at the Orange Show on Sat.10th and Sun.11th May 2014 as has been the practice in past years.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Bob Boaden tabled the treasurer's report and financial statement. Questions invited. He also advised that responses to invoices to advertisers in the club magazine and a minor number of club membship fees were still outstanding and anticipated that they would be finalized in the near future. Accounts to be paid Wangarang Industries Plop mops hand wipes \$60.00 and refund to Chris Bromley \$38.40 magazine postage. Moved Bob Boaden and Sec: Richard Bloomfield that the treasurer's report be accepted and the two accounts be paid. CARRIED.

Editor's Report: Chris Bromley reported that all was well and as previously mentioned, material for inclusion in the magazine was always welcome.

Events Report: John Streefeild reported on past and future events and specifically mentioned the Cumnock Show a good representation of club cars and the display of tractors and non-club vehicles from Don Marroitt's collection. President Keith Packham

reported on the successful bush council rally at Parkes which attracted 165 entries with an excellent variety of cars. ODAMC was well represented and those who participated and were at the meeting supported Keith in his complimentary remarks. Keith is to write to the Parkes Antique Motor Club on behalf of the ODAMC to convey favourable comments to that club for their organization of a successful rally.

A show of hands was called for those to display cars at the Orange Show on 10th-11th May and to date several more will be required to make the display a success. Also on Sunday 11th is also Mother's day and it is proposed that morning tea be held in Cook Park at 11am followed by a short mystery run.

President Keith proposed a 'one day' rally for those who rarely bring their cars out on Motor Heritage Day on Sun. 18th May with short afternoon run followed by a BBQ tea at the club house. Then when both sides have been in and out, including the not outs, that's the end of the game.




