**Treasurer's report:** Treasurer Bob Boaden tabled the treasurer's report and monthly financial statement. Questions invited. A query was raised on the Wangarang account for the club magazine as to correctness of \$120.90 and Bob undertook to verify this outstanding amount prior to payment

Bob presented the OAMPS Insurance Brokers renewal notices for our three club insurance policies i.e. Public Liability (\$354.90). Management Liability (\$125.00) & Voluntary Accident Policy (\$100.) making a total of \$570.90 which is due from 1/10/2014. Discussion took place on the terms of the last mentioned Accident Policy which in the past covered members up to 65 years of age and this year on the plus side has been increased to 75 years of age. However, once a member turns 76 he/she is no longer covered.

Quoting from the accompanying renewal document "Any clubs seeking voluntary workers cover for members aged 76 can apply directly to OAMPS Insurance and a quote will be offered based on the clubs individual circumstances and membership numbers. The cost of any cover for over 75's will be from \$900 annually."

Following discussion from members, present indications are that this is a subject which should be referred to the next half yearly meeting of the CHMC (Bush Council) for discussion between affiliated clubs to consider other options to be explored to ensure coverage for all club members over the age of 75 years. At the next club meeting this subject is to be further discussed with the view that our delegate to the CHMC Keith Packham be instructed to raise this subject at the next CHMC half yearly meeting.

In the interim it was moved Bob Boaden and seconded Peter Amos that the treasurer's Report be accepted and the OAMPS insurance account of \$570.90 be paid and the Wangarang account of \$120.90 be paid after verification as to correctness. CARRIED.

**Editor's report:** Due to prior to commitments Chris was not present at the meeting and no report presented. General comment is that the magazine is well received.

**Events report:** John Streetfeild spoke of events of the past with particular mention of the visit to O'Connell and McFeeter's Motor Museum at Forbes. #### 2014 Camp Quality Tractor Trek

This year's Trek got under way on Wednesday night with drivers meet over a light dinner, put on by the Vietnam Veterans Association. At 6.00 am on Thursday things started to rock and roll, the earth shook as 30 tractors and as many support vehicles rolled out of the Field Day site for three days of organized mayhem, with 330 kms ahead of us at 23Kmh. Down Lidster hill was the first test and all passed it easily, out thru Bowen Park Rd and into Cudal. Head towards Canowindra only to turn off onto the dirt roads and less traffic, zig zagging our way to the lunch stop north east of Eugowra in a farmer's paddock. Following the dirt the now dusty line wound its way across the Parkes Rd into the Back Yamma area [near Cookamidgera]. We spent the night at Forbes, with an Auction fundraiser after dinner, spurred on by a talk from the parents of a young cancer patient. The camp stirred early as the local Lions Club prepared brekky, which was ready by 6.00 O'clock. The Trek rolled on out of town and back to back roads through fields of green wheat and yellow canola, morning tea by the roadside, the convoy pulled up at Eugowra Sportsground for lunch. Mobbed by school kids and little tackers, it was time to hit the trail again, onto Goolagong where the local school had raised over \$400.00 with lollies and cake sales. On a sadder note there are about 19 families affected in that Eugowra. Goolagong Area alone. Canowindra was the overnight stop, another chance to fund raise and have some fun with Dinner. COLD is the only way to describe what greeted us at 5.30 in the morning as we hauled ourselves from our swags, ice covered tents and even inside under tarps, dripping onto slow occupants as it thawed. A couple of km of TAR then back to the bi-ways to reach the Davis Farm for a cuppa put on by the Cargo Bush Fire Group, soon it was time to climb the bowen park hill and onto Borenore for the finish. Total raised for this year's Trek was in excess of \$220K, a great result for the organizers of this year's Trek, well done. Bob.

#### 1979 AMC Concord.

As usual, I try and run a feature of the car on the front cover.

This is a new car to the club, (5177H) my 1979 AMC concord two door, that I recently bought from a collector in Sydney.

It is in original unrestored condition and shows 55 thousnd miles on the odometer. It boasts Power brakes, Power steering, velor interior, and air conditioning, landau vinyl roof, Automatic transmission and a runs an economical 6cyl 265cu engine that runs like a dream.

The car was sold new to an aircraft mechanic in 1979. The original owner sold the car back to the original dealership in Frekrickson, Texas in 2006 after keeping the car for 27 years. The car was then sold to a meuseum in Missouri where it stayed on display until being bought by the collector and imported to Australia in 2010. I think it is the only one in Australia but parts are reasonably easy to come by as it shares the same parts as Australian AMC products.

#### 1979 AMC Concord D/L hatchback

The next model year saw moderate upgrades to keep the luxurious Concord fresh. Front-end styling changed appreciably with a "waterfall" grille with a fine chrome vertical bar treatment, quad rectangular headlights atop slim, wide clear parking/signal lights, and lighter aluminum bumpers were new for 1979. The 3-speed manual transmission was a "downgrade" option for Concord in 1979. The D/L sedan was given a new vinyl roof design which extended only over the rear passenger compartment was complemented by chrome trim that overlaid the <u>B-pillar</u> and wrapped over the vinyl roof at its leading edge. 1979 also saw the introduction of the Limited model, available on coupe, sedan, and wagon models, and appointed with leather upholstery, thick carpeting, full courtesy lighting, body-colored wheel covers, and a standard AM radio. The Concord Limited was very well equipped for a compact car at the time. The D/L package, now the middle trim level, was extended to the hatchback, which was given a brushed aluminum <u>Targa-like</u> roof band and a half-vinyl roof to differentiate it from the standard hatchback.



## A BIT OF HISTORY

Hours after Pearl Harbor was bombed on December 7, 1941, the Secret Service found themselves in a bind. President Franklin D. Roosevelt was to give his Day of Infamy speech to Congress on Tuesday, and although the trip from the White House to Capitol Hill was short, agents weren't sure how to transport him safely.

At the time, Federal Law prohibited buying any cars that cost more than \$750, so they would have to get clearance from Congress to do that, and nobody had time for that. One of the Secret Service members, however, discovered that the US Treasury had seized the bulletproof car that mobster Al Capone owned\_when he was sent to jail in 1931. They cleaned it, made sure it was running perfectly and had it ready for the President the next day.

Mechanics are said to have cleaned and checked each feature of the Caddy well into the night of December 7th, to make sure that it would run properly the next day for the Commander in Chief. And run properly it did. It had been painted black and green to look identical to Chicago's police cars at the time. To top it off, the gangster's 1928 Cadillac Town Sedan had 3,000 pounds of armor and inch-thick bulletproof windows. Footnote: The car was sold at auction in 2012 for \$341,000.
