Get well wishes for Sandra and Brenda after both having separate falls.


I have had a few weeks away with a trip to Alice Spring Truck Reunion then on my return the next day we left for the Buick East Coast Meet at Port Macquarie.


Bob's report on Tractor trek 2015.


Brenda Dwyer's report on the Woodstock lunch run on 23/8/15.

Chevrolet Superior

The **Chevrolet Superior** was launched in 1923, manufactured by <u>Chevrolet</u> for four years with a different series per year. The 1923 model was known as the Series B, the 1924 model was the Series F, for 1925 it was known as the Series K and the 1926 Superior was known as the Series V. It was replaced in 1927 by the <u>Series AA Capitol</u>.



1924 Chevrolet Truck

All Superior models were powered by a 171 cu in (2.8 L) 4-cylinder engine, 26hp @ 2000 rpm, and shared the 103 in (2,616.2 mm) wheelbase. The cheapest complete model, which was the **Superior Roadster**, cost \$510 in 1926, whilst the range-topping model, the **Superior Sedan**, sold for \$825. It was also possible to buy a chassis; the **Commercial** chassis cost \$425, whilst the **Express Truck** chassis cost \$525.

GM Platform sharing[edit]

This chassis was shared with other GM products at the time, including <u>Cadillac</u>, <u>Buick</u>, <u>Oldsmobile</u>, <u>Oakland</u> and <u>GMC</u> products. This policy of sharing mechanicals across multiple brand let to the <u>General Motors Companion Make Program</u> in the 1920s. Starting with leadership under Mr. Sloan, GM instituted <u>visual styling changes</u> for each yearly series.

CLASSICS GET A BETTER RUN WITH CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION TRIAL

Minister for Roads Duncan Gay today announced club vehicles would be on the road again and more often under a new conditional registration scheme trial.

"I encourage you to register with a club for the trial if you have a little beauty tucked away in your garage, so you can bring her out into the sunshine and feel the freedom of the road more often," Mr Gay said.

Original and non-original classic vehicles are currently restricted to club events and maintenance.

Under the two year log-book based trial, owners of over 30 year old vehicles that meet the safety requirements of full registration or the current Historical Vehicle Scheme will be able to opt-in via participating clubs for 60 days of general use each registration year.

"The current Historic Conditional Registration scheme remains unchanged as an option for enthusiasts but, this Government recognised that owners of conditionally registered vehicles had limited use – which was just restricting these mechanical pieces of art," Mr Gay said.

"We've incorporated safe, sensible additions in consultation with the community and stakeholders so owners and the wider community can revel in these vehicles' unique beauty more often."

This NSW Liberals & Nationals initiative will bring NSW into line with several other states while boosting opportunities in the automotive aftermarket industry which contributes \$11 billion to the Australian economy and employs 30,000.

The 60-day Classic Vehicle Log-book trial will commence on 1 October. To opt-in to the scheme contact one of the several hundred NSW enthusiast clubs or visit www.rms.nsw.gov.au/.

Historic Vehicle Log Book Trial - Information Sheet

The Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, Duncan Gay, has asked Transport for NSW and Roads and Maritime Services to develop a Historic Vehicle Log Book Trial.

The log book trial will allow historic vehicles to be used for 60 days of general use (i.e. maintenance and personal use) each year, outside of club organised events. Each day's use must be recorded in a log book issued at a registry or service centre.

The log book trial will operate for two years, with an evaluation to be completed during this period as part of Roads and Maritime's review of the overall Conditional Registration Scheme.

Staged implementation

The log book trial has two stages:

- From 1 October 2015, original condition vehicles that are in, or eligible to be in, the existing Historic
 Vehicle Scheme can be part of the log book trial. Please note that these vehicles must be 30 years of age
 or older, as close to original condition as possible, with no modifications except for safety features such as
 seat belts and turn indicators or period accessories and options, if desired. The registered operator must
 be a member of a Roads and Maritime recognised historic vehicle club.
- In early **2016**, a Modified Historic Vehicle Scheme for non-original historic vehicles will be introduced and these vehicles can be included in the log book trial.

We are an existing recognised club under the Historic Vehicle Scheme that wants to participate

It is not compulsory for clubs to participate in the log book trial. However, recognised clubs must notify Roads and Maritime if they want to participate. Roads and Maritime will maintain a list of participating clubs.

Club officials may notify their participation to Roads and Maritime by email at <u>Historic.vehicle.logbook.trial@rms.nsw.gov.au</u>.

We are an existing recognised club that does not want to participate

There is nothing that the club needs to do. Members of existing recognised clubs continue to be able to use their vehicles in club organised events and maintenance.

Members of existing recognised clubs that do not participate in the log book trial may choose to join or form another recognised participating club, and then opt-in to the log book trial.

I have a conditionally registered historic vehicle and I am a member of a participating historic vehicle club

Members of participating clubs may opt-in to the log book trial from 1 October 2015. To opt in, the registered vehicle operator or their representative must attend a Service NSW centre or registry and present:

- Proof of identity such as a NSW driver licence
- The current Certificate of Conditional Registration (if available)
- The current Certificate of Approved Operations (if available)
- A completed Change of Records (<u>www.rms.nsw.gov.au/documents/about/forms/45070212-adjustment-of-records.pdf</u>) to have the vehicle's conditions updated.

The following condition will be added to the vehicle's existing conditions:

'Historic Log Book – May be used for 60 days per year subject to log book conditions.'

Operators of existing conditionally registered historic vehicles will be issued:

Certificate of Conditional Registration

- Certificate of Approved Operations, with the updated conditions
- Historic Vehicle Log Book Trial form.

There is no cost to existing members that choose to opt into the log book trial.

If I decide to opt-in when will the 60 days commence.

The log book may be used once it is issued. It is planned that the log book will be aligned with the annual registration year of the conditionally registered vehicle. Therefore, a pro rata allocation of days will apply when initially opting-in to the trial based on the number of days remaining on the registration. The allocation is as shown in the following table.

Remaining registration	Allocated log book days	
Up to three months	15	
Over three and up to six months	30	
Over six and up to nine months	45	
Over nine months	60	

I have an unregistered/fully registered historic vehicle and I want to apply for conditional registration

You will first need to join a recognised historic vehicle club. These are listed on the Roads and Maritime website (http://www.rms.nsw.gov.au/documents/roads/registration/get-nsw-registration/vehicle-sheets/historic-vehicle-clubs.pdf).

If you want to opt-in to the log book trial you will need to join a recognised historic vehicle club that is participating in the log book trial.

To conditionally register a vehicle in the Historic Vehicle Scheme, customers must attend a Service NSW centre or registry and present:

- A completed Application for Conditional Registration (www.rms.nsw.gov.au/documents/about/forms/45070939-conditional-reg.pdf)
- Proof of identity such as a NSW driver licence
- Proof of registration entitlement (eg an original receipt for the vehicle, which clearly shows the buyer's name, the seller's name, address and signature, the VIN or Chassis/frame or serial number and the date of acquisition)
- A Historic Vehicle Declaration, signed by a recognised and participating historic vehicle club official, not greater than 42 days old (www.rms.nsw.gov.au/documents/about/forms/45070967-historic-vehicle-declaration.pdf). Please note that a vehicle safety inspection report must be presented if the club is less than two years old.

Operators of newly conditionally registered historic vehicles will be issued:

- Certificate of Conditional Registration
- Certificate of Approved Operations, with the updated conditions
- Historic Vehicle Log Book Trial form (if a member of a participating club).

If you are converting from full registration to conditional registration, you must surrender the full registration and number plates. You may be eligible for a refund of the unused portion of the vehicle tax or registration charge. Please note that a cancellation fee applies. You may also have the full registration number plates reserved at the Service NSW centre or registry or issued to a different vehicle for a fee. Distinctive historic vehicle number plates are issued with the conditional registration for a fee. You may also be eligible for a Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurance premium refund. Please contact your CTP insurer for more information.

How do I become a recognised club under the Historic Vehicle Scheme?

To become a recognised club under the Historic Vehicle Scheme, club officials must complete an Application for a Historic Vehicle Club http://www.rms.nsw.gov.au/documents/about/forms/45071935-application-for-a-historic-vehicle-club.pdf and attach the following information:

- Evidence of the organisation's corporate status (eg Certificate of Registration issued by the Australian Securities and Investment Commission, or Certificate of Incorporation issued by NSW Fair Trading).
- A copy of the club's constitution demonstrating that the club can meet the Historic Vehicle Scheme policy.
 Please see the Historic Vehicle Scheme policy on the Roads and Maritime website at:
 www.rms.nsw.gov.au/roads/registration/get-nsw-registration/historic-vehicles.html.
- A list of the club's officials.
- A list of approved Scrutineers able to conduct Historic Vehicle inspections.
- A list of representatives forming the club's proposed Eligibility Committee.
- The name and contact details of the proposed Eligibility Committee's Responsible Person.
- The inspection process and proof of compliance requirements used to demonstrate that an eligible Historic Vehicle meets the Historic Vehicle Scheme policy.
- Materials (such as policies and procedures documents, etc) that demonstrate the club has professional and safety standards to provide sufficient administrative controls over the following areas:
 - o vehicle construction
 - o vehicle logbooks

What is the proposed Modified Historic Vehicle Scheme

The Modified Historic Vehicle Scheme is being developed to enable historic vehicles that have been modified to obtain similar opportunities for road access that apply to original condition vehicles under the Historic Vehicle Scheme.

The Modified Historic Vehicle Scheme is anticipated to operate in a similar way to the Historic Vehicle Scheme. Things like forming a club, joining a club and applying for conditional registration will be similar. Clubs may also choose to participate in the log book trial.

Existing recognised Historic Vehicle Clubs may also choose to become a club under the Modified Historic Vehicle Scheme.

Some matters currently being worked through with enthusiasts, industry and government stakeholders include the vehicle standards and CTP insurance classification. Modified vehicles require a different process to determine their suitability for safe use and it is important that clubs have this capability.

Logbook Scheme Option for Historic Vehicles in NSW

The Hon. Duncan Gay MLC, NSW Minister for Roads, announced on Friday September 4th the 2 year trial of a new conditional registration scheme for historic vehicles to commence on October 1, 2015.

The Hon. Duncan Gay, MLC - Minister for Roads. Media Release, 4 September 2015 - Classics get a better run with conditional registration trial

Operators of historic (over 30 years old) vehicles will be able to opt-in via their RMS approved club to the scheme which provides for 60 days of general use (i.e. club events, maintenance and personal use) each year. Each day's use must be recorded in a Log Book.

The new scheme does not replace the current Historic Conditional Registration scheme which remains unchanged as an option for enthusiasts.

Eligible vehicles must be -

over 30 years old AND Meet the safety requirements of full registration or the current Historical Vehicle Scheme.

The registered operator must be a member of a Roads and Maritime recognised historic vehicle club.

Council is aware that CHMC clubs may have members who wish to take up the logbook trial scheme and Council anticipates that clubs could have members' vehicles in one of 3 different schemes - either full/normal registration or HVS registration or the new conditional (logbook) scheme registration.

Guidelines for the new conditional registration (logbook) scheme are not yet available however Council is expecting RMS to provide more complete details on the practical aspects of the new scheme, either through Council or direct to the clubs on its Approved List. Council will advise affiliated clubs as soon as it receives any further information from RMS.

Council recommends clubs and club members considering the opt-in offer bide their time on making decisions at least until October 1 or until the full details of the new conditional registration (logbook) scheme are advised.

Council has a strong history of monitoring legislation affecting heritage vehicles and representing its membership to the RMS in all changes made to historic vehicle registration. As CHMC members would be aware Council's officers have been involved for several months in the RMS Focus Group working on a conditional scheme for modified vehicles which is also considering logbooks as part of that agenda. CHMC has been and continues to be proactive in the RMS Focus Group and to the relevant RMS departments to ensure that heritage vehicles are not disadvantaged. Club registrars, committee and members may also monitor details on how to opt-in to the logbook trial as RMS indicate there will be updates on the RMS historic vehicles webpage after October 1, 2015.

Dear customer, Thank you for your interest in the Log Book trial announced by the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight which will commence on 1 October 2015.

The trial will allow all operators of existing vehicles within the Historic Vehicle Scheme to opt-in. These vehicles may then be used for 60 days of general use (i.e. club events, maintenance and personal use) each year. Each day's use must be recorded in the Log Book.

Existing operators To opt in, the registered operator or their representative must attend a registry or service center with:

- proof of identity such as a NSW driver license.
- the current Certificate of Conditional Registration (if available),
- the current Certificate of Approved Operations (if available)
- a completed Adjustment of records to have the vehicle's conditions updated.

New operator's New entrants to the Historic Vehicle Scheme after the trial commences may apply for inclusion in the Log Book Trial, subject to the existing historic vehicle and registered operator eligibility criteria. To conditionally register a vehicle in the Historic Vehicle Scheme, customers must provide:

- a completed Application for Conditional Registration form
- proof of identity such as a NSW driver license
- Proof of registration entitlement (e.g. an original receipt for the vehicle, which clearly shows the buyer's name, the seller's name, address and signature, the VIN or Chassis/frame or serial number and the date of acquisition)
- A Historic Vehicle Declaration not greater than 42 days old. Note: a vehicle safety inspection report must be presented if the club is less than two years old.

Existing and new operators will be issued:

- Certificate of Conditional Registration
- · Certificate of Approved Operations, with the updated conditions
- Historic Vehicle Log Book Trial form

Historic vehicles (including trailers) must be 30 years of age or older as from the year of manufacture.

Historic vehicles must be as close to original condition as possible, with no alterations except for safety features such as seat belts and turn indicators or period accessories and options, if desired.

The registered operator must be a member of a Roads and Maritime recognised historic vehicle club.


