

## RAMBLINGS OF THE RALLY DIRECTOR

I have been interested in vintage cars for most of my adult life. I bought my first car a 1928 Pontiac in 1962 which we paddock bashed and wrecked. My days at the technical college (TAFE) further enhanced my interest in vintage motoring with the teacher being



the late Frank McGowan. My understanding is that Frank McGowan was a foundation member of the veteran car club which I believe started in 1954; this was considered at the time to be a most exclusive club with the apparent scarcity of these vehicles. I was privileged to be able to work on some of his cars namely an Armstrong Whitworth, Vauxhall (which came from Molong) and a early Fiat.

In 1963 I purchased a 1926 Buick which is still not restored (but I am working on it). I joined the vintage car club in 1974 just before the first Easter Rally. I enjoyed the vintage movement and over the years have held various positions in our club from scrutineer to president and most in between. I restored the 1927 Chevrolet in time to attend the 1979 Easter Rally at Wollongong. This was the first Easter Rally we attended which was enjoyed by the family and we attended many more over the following years.

Orange club hosted the 1994 Easter Rally and I was the Rally Director. We had an enthusiastic team and were blessed with good weather, fine food and exceptional sponsorship from local business. This made a very successful rally.

This rally our team has put together an interesting program taking you to some of out smaller villages. Millthorpe museum is well worth a visit and entry has no charge to rally entrants. You can walk around at your leisure or visit many of the historic shops and building in the town. The run to Canowindra is through some scenic drives placing you there for lunch. This is an historic village with a reputation for fine food and wines. There are places of interest to visit including local shops and the Age of Fishes Museum. We hope you can spend an enjoyable afternoon in this village. Canowindra also boasts one of the oldest General Motors dealerships in country New South Wales. (it's worth a look)



# MILLTHORPE

Take a step back in time to an era when children played in the street 'til dark, neighbours yarned over back fences and when you died, you were buried amongst friends. Millthorpe was first settled by Europeans who set up a Government Stock Station in 1823. Originally called Spring Grove the town grew as land was made available for farming and orcharding in the 1860's.

The village reached it's commercial height in the 1870's when the railway arrived and provided farmers with access to Sydney's profitable markets.

The establishment of the Great Western Milling Company in 1882 bought confidence and a change of name to Millthorpe in 1884.

The company became one of the largest millers in the state with staff loading 30 trucks of famous "Waratah" flour and pollard under cover each day for Sydney.

A butter and bacon curing factory opened in the 1870's. The cold stores saved the need to transport milk to Bathurst.

Later a rabbit freezing works was established which continued until the Second World War. This provided many unemployed locals with sustenance during the Great Depression of the 1930's.

Whilst here, sample some local fare at the cafes and view local arts and crafts.

A visit to the Golden Memories Museum, acknowledged as one of the finest in the region, is a must for all to see.



## CABONNE FOOD WINE & CULTURAL CENTRE

This lovely little village is 40km from Orange on the Forbes Road known as the Escort Way. Population is approximately 400.

Originally settled as a stopover on the way to the Forbes gold fields. Built on the banks of the Boree Creek known for platypus and trout.

Cudal used to be the headquarters of the Boree Shire Council and now forms part of Cabonne Shire.

Main industries are farming and grazing, wine making vineyards with the headquarters of Canobolas Wine on the Cargo Road. A new industry is in its infancy is an egg farm of 240,000 layers housed in barns (barn laid eggs).

For many years Cudal was home to Hazelton Airlines and Air Services. At their peak, Hazelton was the largest regional airline, and its 30 agricultural planes made it the biggest family operated airline in Australia.



# CANOWINDRA

CANOWINDRA has starred in films, TV series and advertisements. With its famous crooked main street, it is a town with more history than most. In 1829 the "Limits of Location" proclamation forbade settlement north of the Belubula River. By 1850 a village was operating at an accessible crossing point and followed the river bank in defiance of the official plans.

Ben Hall put the town on the map in 1864 when his gang took over the pub for three days. Passes were issued to those who needed to go about their business, on condition that they returned, which they did!

Canowindra grew and prospered as a service town for the surrounding rich farmlands and as a major river crossing point for north south traffic. With the growing prosperity came agitation for a railway service, but it was not until 1910 that the first train arrived from Cowra. At one time it was the highest paying freight line in the State due to the huge quantity of lucerne and chaff sent to Sydney. As with many country towns the line has closed.


Today Canowindra serves a dual role as a centre for the numerous trotting studs, farms and vineyards and provides a mecca for tourists. The Annual Balloon Fiesta acknowledges its claim as Australia's Balloon Capital. The Age of Fishes Museum has international recognition.

## HISTORY OF ORANGE DISTRICT ANTIQUE MOTOR CLUB

Prior to the club formation in 1972 several enthusiasts would travel to Dubbo for a car club meeting each month. In May 1972 an inaugural meeting was held at the Hotel Canobolas which was attended by 77 enthusiastic families, this group became the foundation members as they formed the 'Central Western Vintage Veteran Auto Club'. The meetings were then held at the Orange Public School. As a relatively new club they hosted the 1975 Bush Council Easter Rally.

In January 1980 the members inspected an abandoned and vandal damaged building. In February of that year the Lands Department gave tenancy to the club and a lease was taken out on the old Bloomfield School on 1st March 1980. This building is still our current club house. In 1985 a board of trustee's was appointed from within the Club.

The land was first owned by Joseph Moulder, he built his first home near Gosling creek and called it 'Bloomfield'. During the latter part of the 1800's the area further developed to a thriving village, supporting a Post Office, a branch of NSW frozen meats, a Hospital and a community involved in mixed farming.

A provisional school was formed in November 1886 followed by the building of the public school in 1899. Students travelled to the school from a wide area. For that era an unusual means of transport was by train, with the students alighting at the Bloomfield siding. The school closed in 1962. The first Canobolas Country Rally was held in 1981 and the club has continued holding this rally every three years with the next one to be held over the long weekend in October this year.

In 1987 the club became incorporated and the name was changed to "Orange District Antique Motor Club'.

The club hosted the Easter Rally for the second time in 1994 with 200 plus entries. The inaugural Autumn Tour was held in April 2005; this event has been held every two years and is specifically for pre 1931 models.

The club is now hosting the third Easter Rally which coincides with celebrating our 40th anniversary in vintage motoring in Orange.

Although our club is relatively small with only 50 plus members we are still able to host rallies, with this being the third Easter Rally with a Canobolas Country Rally every three years and Autumn Tour every two years. We have monthly runs and events plus numerous social activities.

We have an obligation with our lease to maintain the building. Over the years we have added toilets and a concrete floored out door area. Last year a major project of painting and repairs was done by club members.
