I typed <u>odamc.org.au</u> and went straight in. There is a lot of information about the club events including Canobolas Rally entry form. Other items are of general interest to car owners.


Please send your entry forms to Anne ASAP as we will have to decide whether to go ahead at the Sep meeting.

There is a flyer regarding the Lyndhurst fair and market day to be held on 21st October.

From July 1, 2018, there is no longer a requirement to display a registration label on conditionally registered vehicles including vehicles in the Historic Vehicles Scheme (HVS) and Classic vehicles (CVS). The decision to abolish registration labels was made at a national level with each state's roads authority agreeing to the proposal. This Australia wide initiative was intended to reduce red tape and provide improvements for the general public. Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) commenced these changes in January 2013 with the removal of labels for all general issue, light vehicle registrations, however, at that time it was not possible to include conditionally registered vehicles (HVS and CVS)

The RMS has now formally advised CHCM that the requirement to display registration labels on all NSW registered vehicles, including HVS and CVS has been removed. This is in keeping with the Road Transport (vehicle registration) regulation 2017. Clubs and HVS/CVS vehicle operators can find further information and some FAQs on the RMS website.

Annual Inspection Day

The Annual Club Inspection Day will be held on Sunday 25th November 2018 at the Car Club Building starting from 8am.

Vehicles on conditional registration with the ODAMC with a registration expiry date between 25th November 2018 and 25th May 2019 will be inspected on this day. This is because the certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) and the club safety checks are now valid for 6 months. If you are unable to attend on the day then a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) may be required for the vehicle.

The following documentation will need to be sighted and details recorded by the Registration Officer on the day.

- 1. Historic Vehicle Declaration (RMS form #1259) partially filled out.
- 2. Registration Papers Current or renewal.
- 3. Current certificate of Comprehensive Insurance.
- 4. Proof of Club Membership.
- 5. Certificate of Operations for the vehicle (Purple Form kept in the vehicle).

Note

The annual inspection of vehicles on Conditional Registration outside of the expiry dates listed above may require either an ODAMC roadworthy check or a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip). This will be at the discretion of the Registration Officer.

The Historic Vehicle Declaration Form will <u>not</u> be signed off this year unless the above documents are sighted and details recorded by the Club Registration Officer beforehand.

Club members with vehicles of HCRS are reminded if their membership fees are not paid by the due date they are not financial members and their registration and CTP will be void! (ie the vehicle is unregistered and uninsured).

Marcus Allaway's 1969 Ford Falcon Futura Station Wagon

Before shots



My car is a 1969 Ford Falcon Futura wagon. It has a factory 302 Windsor V8 unleaded for 94 ron petrol and a 3 speed manual column shift. It has 4 wheel drum brakes, not boosted no power steering or AC and manual clutch. Only 7200 of this model where made in 69. This particular car was made in Canada, so not many left. It is almost a foot longer than the Australian model. The bonnet, 2 front doors, floor pans and windscreen are the same as the ones made here, the rest is different, even the park brake is foot type, It was never registered in the US. It was driven new, across the USA, on a permit, for shipping to Australia for use by the Military in the US Embassy in the ACT. It was then used for 10 years as transport to and from the Airport and trips around Canberra. It was then sold to an Aussie worker who used it until 1986 when he had a few to many crashes in it and parked it up in and old shed. We got wind it was up for sale and bought it. We pulled many big dings out, I pulled the engine out and reconditioned it, got it hot tanked and bored 30 thou and put it back together and gave the car a repaint in yellow, It was originally a dark green metallic colour. I put it on full rego as I use it most days, it seems to be the only 69 wagon in Australia. Some coupes and sedans have come here in the last 10 years but no Wagons.
