#### **General Business:**

Secretary reported that there had been a recent meeting to discuss our finances consisting of the present principal Officer bearers and members of the incoming Committee. The main topic was the cost of the magazine.

At present, per monthly issue, printing 32 copies costs \$64 per issue, plus \$48 for folding, stapling and posting. (About half the costs are for handling). As per previous minutes members indicated that they would like to keep the present Magazine format.

The finance meeting felt that we should aim to reduce these costs as Treasurer had prepared a forward budget showing that to keep going as at present would result in a loss on operating expenses, apart from any capital items, even though subscriptions have already been raised this year. Since the meeting the magazine editor has conducted a review and will only send magazines to other clubs by email. It was proposed that we cease to post out the magazine, continue to send magazines by email to members, but hard copies will be available at each meeting for those members who require them. It was felt that 15 printed copies only would be sufficient, as there were only a small number of members without Computer access. Magazine Editor felt he could further reduce costs by keeping each issue to 10 pages maximum. We could then absorb this cost. It was further felt that any future capital items (such as new water heater) should be taken from the Term Deposit monies. It was proposed that we desist with advertisers as apart from one exception, payments were well behind despite reminders, and if each advertiser received a posted magazine there was no profit to the Club.

This was presented to members at the meeting and after much lively discussion, the motion was put: That for a trial period of three months magazines would only be forwarded by email, but hard copies would be available at each monthly meeting. Prop: Keith Packham. Sec: John Nicholson. Carried. The matter of using the term deposit monies for capital items would be implemented in the future. And that we will desist with advertisers.

Bruce Heinrich reported the blocked downpipe work was held up by the breakdown of the concrete saw, but was being pursued.

Peter Amos agreed to attend to the purchase of the raffle prizes in lieu of Bob McNeil.

The outgoing President thanked the members for their support and announced trophy winners.


