UPDATE ON MAINTENANCE PROJECTS AT CLUB ROOMS.

Dear Euan,

Set out are the current projects which were approved at the February meeting of the ODAMC club rooms and others which are under consideration as requested for the March meeting.

- 1. Attendance on 3/3/21 of B & H to measure for three blinds and order confirmed on 5/3/21 as per quote of \$725.00 and ready for installation in about 2 weeks.
- 2. Gutters cleaned on 24/2/21 by Graham Fitzgerald from Gutter Vac and invoice to be sent to car club mail box. Gutter cleaning will be an ongoing problem and needs a second downpipe.
- 3. Two new Bromic brand LP replacement gas heaters as previously ordered from Tates Plumbing collected on 9/3/21 and account for same of \$998.58 paid for with club cheque. Installation of bayonet fittings arranged with plumber gas fitter Dave Bastik yet to be carried out possibly during week of club meeting. Anticipated cost in vicinity of \$400.00 for labour and fittings. The question of the disposal off the old gas heaters needs to be addressed
- 4. The funding from NSW Lands for the removal of the tree adjacent to the entry gate off Louie Lane and other stump and root grinding as per quote from Livingstone's Tree Services has been approved but has not been deposited in the club bank account at the time of writing and will be attended to on arrival of the funds. A further question arrives as to what to do with another tree in the paddock behind the toilet block which has expired since the application for funding was applied for 12 months ago. Should this also be attended to whilst Livingstone's Services are attending to the quoted tree removal at club expense?

It should be noted that the trees in the club property were most likely planted at the time the building was constructed and as age has caught up with them they will be an ongoing problem.

OTHER PROJECTS WHICH HAVE BEEN DISCUSSED AND ARE DUE FOR FURTHER ATTENTION AND GENERALLY RELATE TO ONGOING MAINTENANCE.

- 1. The lining of the ladies and gents' toilets as well as the adjacent storeroom where the club barbecue is stored. This would be a minimal cost as the necessary fibro sheeting is on hand but about 10 metres of 3x2 timber will be required for ceiling battens. A 600mm shelf is required around the side and rear wall (donated material available) to store rally paraphernalia which currently cluttering the main club house storeroom. Support brackets to be purchased for the shelving.
- 2. It would be an advantage if a presentable hand basin could be donated to replace the existing one in the lady's toilet which is badly stained.

- 3. Door on generator room to be adjusted due to difficulty in closing and a weather flashing already on hand to be screwed on over door similar to the toilet doors. Barge board above door and eastern side required sanding/ undercoating and painting.
- 4. Flood light to installed in vicinity of entry door facing the car park and the existing sensor light moved over to above the door of the generator room which would be a deterrent to unauthorised removal of same. The installation of the flood light was approved at a club meeting early in 2020.
- 5. The main club house storeroom need a major clean up with surplus items disposed of to allow access to necessary items. It is currently impossible to access the so-called library and other items which are required on a regular basis. The club house has ample storage when combined with the previously mentioned storeroom in the amenities block and the generator room clean out.
- 6. Suggestions have been put forward to instal a window in the southern wall of the outdoor extension to allow more daylight in and a visual perspective to the outside. It is not a high priority but members thoughts on this subject would be welcome.
- 7 Two working bees should be scheduled, the first to clean up the main club room club and kitchen with the proviso that the bat problem needs to be removed from inside the building. It would seem that bats are coming down the chimney and leaving their excrement on the walls, floor, photos of cars and other items of display. These all need a thorough clean up and consideration given to shampooing the carpet. Bats are well known for ability to transmit various infections and at the present time process of sealing off the chimney access is underway after which the clean-up should be carried out.
- 8. The second working bee of about half a dozen members will be required later in the winter for a burn up of fallen timber and sticks in the north eastern corner paddock mainly from dead poplar trees which have appeared since the last winter clean-up which was shortened by rain. This is to be arranged in conjunction with Mr. Steph O'Dea the neighbour who runs the stock in the club grounds and who in the past has arranged a fire permit and made available his standby fire fighting unit.
- 9. The above resume' is reasonably comprehensive and can be worked through during 2021 and are generally required to improve the efficiency of the running of the club. Apart from the major cost items which have been approved the remainder are reasonably cost negative and in general undertaken with voluntary effort by club members when required.
- 10. As a final comment is all very nice to promote the fact that the car club has its' own 'club house' and is the envy of other visiting clubs, it does not come without cost both financially and in kind.

LICENCE REQUIREMENTS AND HVS VEHICLES

- Council received queries about a clause that appeared on the RMS webpage late last year regarding Licence requirements and HVS/CVS vehicles.
- The clause indicated that HVS renewal could only be made by the holder of a current driver's licence. There was also a report that there were difficulties experienced by a HVS owner being initially refused HVS renewal at a Service NSW office as they no longer held a drivers licence.
- Council's RMS Liaison Officer pursued these matters with TfNSW.
- CHMC now has confirmation from TfNSW that this clause was an error and it has been removed from its webpage.

Note:

- 1. Registration is a separate issue to holding the appropriate licence to drive/operate a vehicle.
- 2. You do not require a specific licence to register a vehicle, although of course, it is required to operate one.
- 3. Registration renewals can be done by those who are not necessarily the Registered Operator (ie. the name that is on the Registration Paper) of the HVS/CVS vehicle to be renewed.
- 4. A HVS/CVS renewal can be transacted at Service NSW by anyone authorised by the vehicle's Registered Operator to do so, they simply must have the correct documents, i.e. a completed Form 1259, and proof of identity if required.
- When a Club has **no additional requirements** involving vehicle use within its Constitution, Council suggests that the following may be appropriate clauses to include in Club Newsletters:
 - a. It is a condition of HVS and CVS that the Registered Operator is a member of a TfNSW
 Recognised Historic Vehicle Club whenever the vehicle accesses public roads or road related areas. This includes static displays.
 - b. The driver does not have to be a club member but must hold an appropriate licence for the vehicle being driven.
 - c. When the vehicle is on the Log Book Scheme, the current Log Book and Certificate of Approved Operations must be carried in the vehicle at all times. However, a Log Book entry is only required for non-club runs, personal use, and maintenance.
 - d. Only one entry per day is required for Log Book use, regardless of how many drivers or trips taken on that particular day
 - e. Vehicles that are driven contrary to either the HVS or CVS registration conditions are not covered for insurance by either Shannons or NRMA Classic. Owners should refer to their Product Disclosure Statement (PDS).
 - f. Carrying a Club Magazine /Events Listing and current Membership Card/Receipt, while not a HVS or CVS requirement, is regarded as a worthwhile practice.

HERITAGE MOTORING UPDATE

CHMC, along with others representing *Transport for NSW* Recognised Motor Clubs, met last week with leaders of the *TfNSW Stakeholder*, *Vehicle Standards and Technical teams* for the regular *Historic and Classic Car Industry Working Group* meeting.

Significant topics discussed included:

- TfNSW advised that it had received many submissions following release of the *Historic* Vehicle Scheme period options, accessories and safety items list. It emphasised that the list remains a working draft.
- A "version two" is being developed for club guidance, in line with the commitment to update the document.
- The *Historic and Classic Car Industry Working Group* will Workshop "version two", most likely after Easter, to review the Options/Accessories list prior to distribution to Clubs.
- Business rules will be developed for clubs accessing HVS and CVS. The process will be for TfNSW to develop draft rules; then consult widely with industry; then seek ministerial approval.
- TfNSW is considering a proposal for optional registration plates that permit a "tidy" installation on vehicles such as early Ford Falcons and some imported and exotic vehicles.
 These plates would carry the HVS or CVS numbers and suffix with a NSW Historic (HVS) or NSW Classic (CVS) sub line. Personalised HVS/CVS number plates are not being considered.
- Nothing has changed relating to fitment of Seat Belts to early vehicles. TfNSW has strongly
 denied rumours that vehicles with seat belts fitted to non-compliant anchorage points
 would be defected.
- Despite an inaccurate statement on the TfNSW web page, HVS registration of Tractors,
 Trucks and Military Vehicles is proceeding as it has for many years. The statement on the
 website is inconsistent with TfNSW policy, and an undertaking has been given to have this
 reference removed from the website ASAP.
- TfNSW assured the meeting that Industry will be consulted before any changes are made to vehicles eligible for either HVS or CVS.
- GVM increase for CVS from 3.5t to 4.5t has passed internal TfNSW consultation and was endorsed by the meeting. It will now proceed to the Ministerial approval process.

Council fully endorses these regular Industry meetings with TfNSW. They are opportunities to resolve issues that arise from the procedures and operation of HVS and CVS schemes directly with the decision makers.

More discussion on these, and other aspects of Historic and Classic vehicle registration, will take place at Council's Annual General Meeting at Temora on Friday April 9th.
