On the Sunday, Steve again gave his talk to interested onlookers & then harnessed up the wagon for more wagon rides. A log snig competition was held which certainly tested both the horse and handler. The Open "Golden Plough" competition was completed and won by the previous champion, Jason Gavenlock from Cowra. Rosemary Amos was excited to see the horses owned by Jason carried her grandfather's brand – great to see this still living on and used by the family. David & I thoroughly enjoyed catching up with many members of the Australian Draught Horse Stud Book Society some of whom we had not seen for many years and spend time watching these beautiful horses doing what they were bred to do – work! We really appreciated seeing the horses enjoying challenges and listening to their handlers as they were long reigned around the different obstacle courses and of course ploughing. Sorry my photos are not included but the Golden Plough or Australian Draught Horse Studbook Society has many on its website & on Facebook. I would like to point out that the Australian Draught Horse is a type not a breed and the many different breeds of heavy horses can be registered as an Australian Draught so long as they meet the conformation criteria of the studbook.

One last thing – there was the inevitable raffle of a painting (of draught horses of course) which was won by our friend Jan, who was staying with us for the weekend!

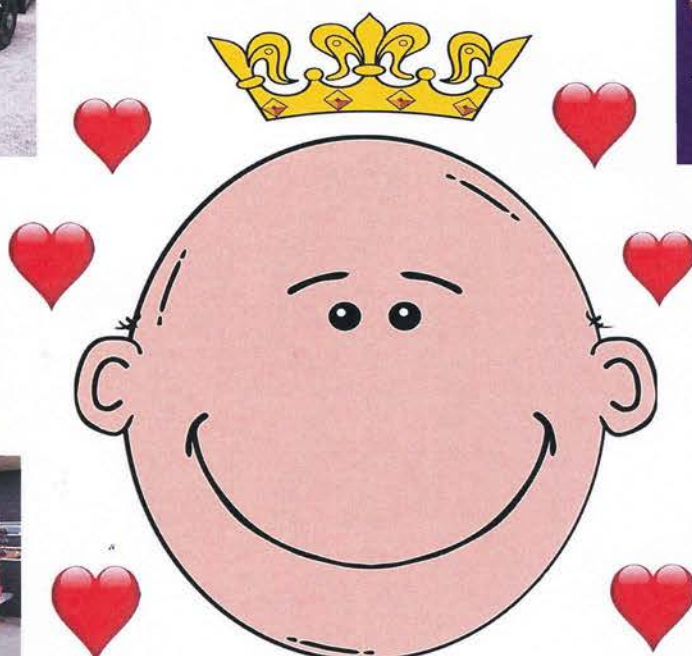

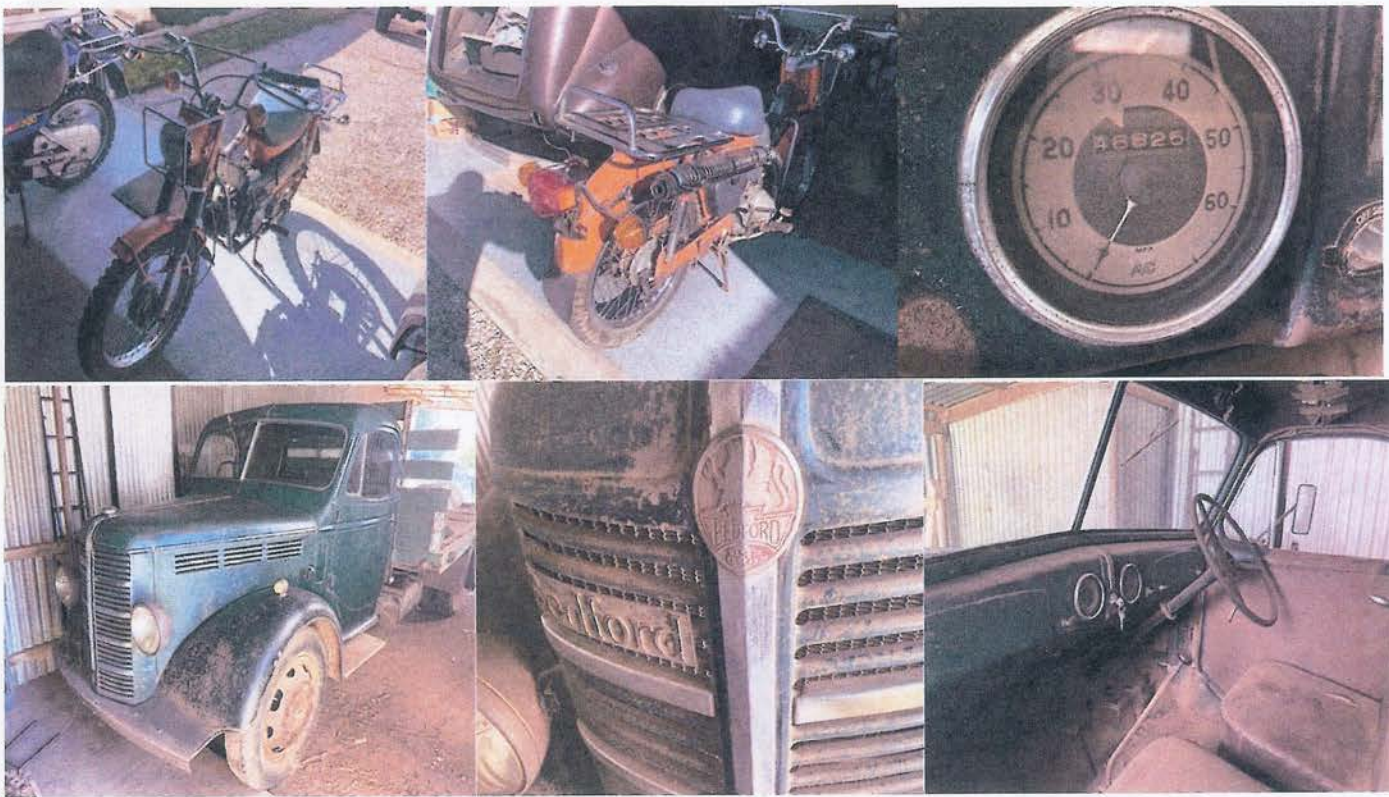
