Annual Inspection Day

The Annual Club Inspection Day will be held on Sunday 28th November 2021 at the Car Club Building starting from 8.30am.

Vehicles on conditional registration with the ODAMC with a registration expiry date between 29th November 2021 and 29th May 2022 will be inspected on this day. This is because the certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) and the club safety checks are now valid for 6 months. If you are unable to attend on the day then a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) may be required for the vehicle.

The following documentation will need to be sighted and details recorded by the Registration Officer on the day.

- 1. Historic Vehicle Declaration (RMS form #1259) partially filled out.
- 2. Registration Papers Current or renewal.
- 3. Current certificate of Comprehensive Insurance.
- 4. Proof of Club Membership.
- 5. Certificate of Operations for the vehicle (Purple Form kept in the vehicle). <u>Note</u>

The annual inspection of vehicles on Conditional Registration outside of the expiry dates listed above may require either an ODAMC roadworthy check or a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip). This will be at the discretion of the Registration Officer.

The Historic Vehicle Declaration Form will <u>not</u> be signed off unless the above documents are sighted and details recorded by the Club Registration Officer beforehand.

Club members with vehicles of HCRS are reminded if their membership fees are not paid by the due date, they are not financial members and their registration and CTP will be void! (I.e. the vehicle is unregistered and uninsured).

Please note. As this event is listed in the club newsletter, it is a club event and as a result comes under the "Casual gatherings" category of covid 19 Restrictions/Regulations. To promote our own safety and to enable the club to meet this legal requirement and avoid a hefty fine to the club or individuals, Drivers only in the vehicle and you are required to leave the club house building and grounds as soon as your car has been checked and you have completed your paperwork. This will enable other club members to come and have their vehicles inspected. There will be no refreshments at the club house this year. The following article has been forwarded by Graeme Barwick and written by Richard Edmunds.

Crankless Engine

This is approx, 5/8 scale model of 985cc capacity, of the 8 cylinder Crankless engine.

Crankless Engines (Aust) was formed in Melbourne in 1920 to develop and manufacture a new engine design invented in about 1917 by Australian resident Anthony George Maldon Michell. The Grankless Engine was based on a simple yet ingenious method of eliminating many moving parts by replacing the crankshaft, connecting rods and bearings of conventional organes with a moving ilanted plate which transmits motion to pistom via labricated slipper blocks attached to the pistons with universal joints.

The patent application for the crankless engine was made on 19th June 1917. Crankless Engines (Australia) Pay Lad was established 24th August 1920 by Anthony George Maldon Michell who was born in Islington, London on 21st June 1870. He studied Civil and Mining Engineering at the University of Melbourne, where he graduated with first-class honours (R.C.E., 1895; M.C.E., 1899). He achieved fame with the invention of the Michell Thruss Bearing, which enabled the building of Leger and faster ships. He also invented a centrifugal pump (patented 1901), a viscometer and a scheme for hydronic power transmission. At the age of 80 be published The Principles of Lubrication.

Crankless Engines (Australia) Pry Ltd was established to develop the designs, manufacture procompes and secure licences from overseas manufactures for large-scale production. They operated from a factory at 129-131 Greece's Street, Fitzroy, Melbourne. The name of the company changed to Crankless Engines Limited when it became a public company on March 1924. The company ceased operations in Melbourne in 1928, although designing and manufacturing proceeded in England and the USA, primarily under George Waller and Sons of Strougl, Hampshire.

In private practice, Michell was a consultant to the Mount Lyell Mining and Railway Company Limited, designing the pump machinery for the Marray Valley irrigation works, as well as acting as investigator for the Victorian government of the hydroelectric possibilities of the Kiewa Rover. Michell became a Fellow of the Royal Society in 1934, received the University of Melbourne's Kernot Memorial Medal in 1938 and was awarded the James Watt International Medal by the Institute of Mechanical Engineers (UK) in 1943.
