The Latest on the Clubrooms.

Members will be aware that our Clubrooms are on Crown Land managed by the dept of Lands. We have no formal lease even though we have been there since 1975(6?).

Our land, along with a lot of other Crown land in the area, is to be handed to the Local aboriginal Lands Council who are going to use the old school as a training facility for Aboriginal Girls. We are going to have to vacate. The formal hand over is expected to be in June 2022. The Crown Lands with the help of Orange Council are committed to help us to find other suitable premises

The Management Committee has been deputized to handle the matter on behalf of the Club. Three members of the Club's management Committee had an onsite meeting on Thursday 25th November, with representatives of Crown Lands and the Orange Council to assess our needs. The meeting was positive and we are impressed that both parties understand our needs and are committed to make a genuine effort to help.

During the discussions the following was forthcoming:

- 1. We have an undertaking that we will be allowed to stay until after the Autumn (pre'31) Tour, but our move out will be after that date.
- 2. The Council mentioned a number of potential sites in the area that they own and will contact us shortly so that we may inspect some options.
- 3. They are aware that we would like a similar dedicated space with some parking for our activities.
- 4. We will probably have to pay a token rent, as do other Community Groups who use Council Property, but Council do maintain their properties completely.
- 5. We will be able to remove all our property from the Clubrooms.

We know that this is a big disruption to our Club but feel that the Lands Dept and the Council are making a genuine effort. If you have any concerns while these negotiations are going on please contact the Club Management Committee.

Marcus Allaway, was a member of several clubs in the area and had a variety of cars. He will also be sadly missed and our condolences to his family and friends.



His final line was always "well its correct twice a day "Sadly missed by all and our thoughts go out to his family.

Tony Agland was a long-time sponsor of the ODAMC Newsletter.

Anne wrote, Tony also had an auto electrical shop in Orange for years before semi retiring and doing work from his home at Mullion Creek, he was very respected in the motor trades as a brilliant tradesman. Owen would vouch for that. He was a member of the Sporting Car Club and also in Rotary. A truly lovely man who fought a long battle but helped out if he knew you needed his expertise. So much knowledge gone with him.

Tony was also Kevins cousin. Kevin wrote an article about his experience with Tony back in the 1970s

I joined a partnership in 1972 with two bee keepers, trading as ORANGE BEE FARMS running about 1200 hives. We had a fleet of vehicles, two international Perkins Diesel trucks. Hive loaders, two cars and a ute that all had to be maintained in top condition. We would go into the Pilliga Forest at different times of the year. Once we were there, we were miles away from help should anything go wrong. We where usually away for two weeks at a time and when we had two loads of honey, we would leave the forest and bring the honey in for extracting at Borenore. On our way home we would call into the first service station and make a call to Margaret to let her know the time we would be home; we often blew tyres so didn't get home until after midnight. During this time and for many years later our vehicles were taken to Tony (my cousin) at Canobolas Auto Electrics to be fixed. He always did an excellent job and same day service.
