To: All CHMC Affiliated Clubs, Re: HVS & CVS Registration Update

Dear Members

The Council of Heritage Motor Clubs' latest Forum on August 27th was convened by Peter Wright, Council's Transport for NSW (TfNSW) Liaison Officer. Our speakers were Matthew Cafe, TfNSW Partnerships Manager, and Stephen Richards, Leading Senior Constable, NSW Police Force. Both have historic vehicles so also know well the practicalities of conditional vehicle registration and usage.

The meeting was booked-out with clubs from the Illawarra, Sydney, Bathurst, Lithgow, Central Coast, Hunter, North Coast and New England present to hear the Q&A forum-style discussions covering a wide range of topics. Just a few of the points raised and answered were:

Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS):

Provides an option to preserve and use historic vehicles, at cost lower than full NSW registration.

• Options and choices for personalized and custom number plates are available via accessing full NSW registration, and choosing from the MyPlates website.

• The HVS and CVS schemes operate on the NSW Conditional Registration platform, along with tractors and plant etc. Online HVS registration is not possible as it is runs on the old conditional registration platform.

Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS):

CHMC has made minor changes to its process for CVS registration approvals; these maintain its procedures at the standard of operation expected by TfNSW for all CVS Approved Organisations (AOs).

A new Classic Vehicle number plate is continuing through the TfNSW approval process.

Log Books:

• Log books ARE NOT compulsory; the registered operator decides if they wish to obtain one and they are in an appropriate club.

Simple instructions for their correct use are on pg. 4 of every current Log Book.

Log Book questions occupied significant time at the Forum, so it was good to hear that a Log Book Fact Sheet is being developed by TfNSW and will be distributed to all clubs that provides answers to the many commonly asked questions around log books.

Club organised events:

• No entry in the Log Book is required for club events, which can include travel from home to the event by the most practicable route if diarised accordingly, and club sanctioned interstate tours. If you deviate from the route of the club organised event, e.g. to visit friends, that is personal use, and must be entered in the Log Book.

Club Runs must be formally recorded in the Club's Minutes, including invitations accepted.

Period Options, Accessories and Safety Items List:

- A replacement is being developed by TfNSW. Extensive industry consultation has taken place.
- TfNSW has committed to a wide-ranging communication strategy around this.
