Hi members,

Please read the October minutes which explains why the vote for the proposed changes to the Constitution will be held at the November monthly meeting.

The wording of the motion, proposed by Anne Magill, you will be voting on is "accepting all the proposed changes as per the draft excepting the change to section 3(b), described in the published proposals as section 3(c)."

Whatever the outcome of the vote, this means the present voting procedure with a spouse having the same voting rights as the member, will remain unchanged.

If you vote <u>for</u> the proposed changes as printed in October's magazine all the amendments listed (except the section 3(b), printed as section 3 (c) in the proposal) will become the Constitution. If you vote <u>against</u> the proposal the Constitution will remain unchanged.

You are reminded that to effect any change there has to be a majority vote of 2/3rds of the members present at the meeting.

# **Annual inspection Day**

The Annual Club Inspection Days will be held on consecutive Sundays, Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> November and Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> December 2022 at the Old Trotting Track clubhouse starting from 8.30am on both days. Bob has requested that you bring a mug, some lunch or the BBQ will be available for you use, milk, tea and coffee will also be available.

Vehicles on conditional registration with the ODAMC with a registration expiry date between 29<sup>th</sup> November 2022 and 29<sup>th</sup> May 2023 will be inspected on this day. This is because the certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) and the club safety checks are now valid for 6 months. If you are unable to attend on either day then a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip) may be required for the vehicle. The following documentation will need to be sighted and details recorded by the Registration Officer on the day.

- Historic Vehicle Declaration (RMS form #1259) partially filled out.
- 2. Registration Papers Current or renewal.
- Current certificate of Comprehensive Insurance.
- 4. Proof of Club Membership.
- 5. Certificate of Operations for the vehicle (Purple Form kept in the vehicle).

#### Note

The annual inspection of vehicles on Conditional Registration outside of the expiry dates listed above may require either an ODAMC roadworthy check or a certificate of roadworthiness (Pink Slip). This will be at the discretion of the Registration Officer.

The Historic Vehicle Declaration Form will <u>not</u> be signed off unless the above documents are sighted and details recorded by the Club Registration Officer beforehand.

Club members with vehicles of HCRS are reminded if their membership fees are not paid by the due date, they are not financial members and their registration and CTP will be void! (I.e. the vehicle is unregistered and uninsured).






