 vehicle club. The new RMS "Log Book and Club Run" Fact Sheet will be emailed by TfNSW directly
 to all clubs in a print ready format. We will alert you to this when it has been distributed.
- The CVS weight limit is still 3.5T GVM for all vehicles
- When renewing CVS registration please ensure that you use CVS Renewal Agreement Form

EV CONVERSIONS. Conversion of an historic internal combustion engined vehicle to

electric drive is such a substantial departure from original design as to render it ineligible to be considered as a heritage vehicle by CHMC. This position was endorsed by delegates at CHMC's meeting on October 29th 2022, and is in accord with that of FIVA, the international peak body for historic vehicles: https://fiva.org/download/electrification-of-historic-vehicles/. 




