PREMIER RALLY 6^{TH} TO 10^{TH} MARCH 2023.



This is an outline of the premier Rally, organized for the Veteran Car Club (NSW) and sponsored by the National Trust, Paul Butler foundation. The Rally is only open to Vehicles built before 1919 and we have 18 entries so far, mostly from Sydney and Newcastle based members plus a few from other areas. The best place to see the cars would be on Wednesday morning at the Coffee stop at Larder and Home, Lucknow, or on Friday at Millthorpe museum from about 11am.

On Tuesday the Rally will travel to the historic Errowanbang Woolshed with a talk about this historic property with morning tea provided and then to travel to Carcoar for a look at the "town time forgot" and lunch at the Hotel. Run of about 120kms

Wednesday, the Rally will assemble at Lucknow for optional coffee from 9am and from there use backroads to Bathurst for lunch at Miss Traill's Cottage provided by the local National Trust Volunteers, who will also give tours and a talk on this Historic property. Run of about 140kms.

Thursday the Rally will tour on quiet back roads to the Millthorpe Museum for morning tea and tour of this renowned Museum. Afternoon there is a choice to stay in the historic Millthorpe Village or there will be an optional afternoon tour on quiet back roads to return to Orange.

We feel Orange is a good place to hold the event with quiet roads and plenty to see.






The Blue Run 2023. Suicide Awareness Ride
